Greater Moncton International Airport Authority (GMIAA) is continuing to monitor developments related to the spread of the coronavirus disease (COVID-19). The health and wellness of our passengers, visitors, business partners and employees are our top priority.

Airline Operations

Reminder that our airline schedule may change at anytime, passengers are asked to contact their airline for the latest information about their flight.

WESTJET^{\vee}

WestJet currently operates 3 days a week to Toronto (YYZ) on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays and will continue until August 4; however, beginning July 5 departures will change from 1500 to 1255.

AIR CANADA∠

All flights to:

- Toronto (YYZ) and Montreal (YUL) routes are currently suspended and will resume activity starting Monday, June 22 with one daily flight to YYZ and YUL until June 30. For the month of July, YYZ and YUL routes will operate twice daily (exceptions may apply).
- Halifax (YHZ) and Ottawa (YOW) are suspended until September 7. Both services are expected to resume activity September 8.

PORTER[∠]

Porter Airlines flights are temporary suspended and expected to resume activity July 29.

SWOOP[∠]


