Update from Greater Moncton International Airport Authority

Greater Moncton International Airport Authority (GMIAA) is continuing to monitor developments related to the spread of the coronavirus disease (COVID-19). The health and wellness of our passengers, visitors, business partners and employees are our top priority.

Airline Operations

Reminder that our airline schedule may change at anytime, passengers are asked to contact their airline for the latest information about their flight.

WESTJET[↵]

WestJet currently operates 3 days a week to Toronto (YYZ) on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays and will continue until August 4; however, beginning July 5 departures will change from 1500 to 1255.

AIR CANADA[↵]

All flights to:

- Toronto (YYZ) and Montreal (YUL) routes are currently suspended and will resume activity starting Monday, June 22 with one daily flight to YYZ and YUL until June 30. For the month of July, YYZ and YUL routes will operate twice daily (exceptions may apply).
- Halifax (YHZ) and Ottawa (YOW) are suspended until September 7. Both services are expected to resume activity September 8.

PORTER[↵]

Porter Airlines flights are temporary suspended and expected to resume activity July 29.

SWOOP[↵]

As a result of the impacts of COVID-19, Swoop has postponed planned service to [#MonctonYQM](#).

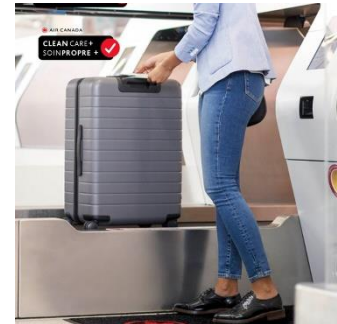

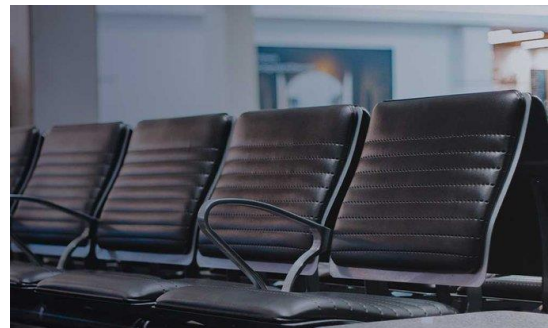

HOW TO SAFELY USE A NON-MEDICAL MASK OR FACE COVERING

DO'S

-  **DO** wear a non-medical mask or face covering to protect others.
-  **DO** inspect the mask for tears or holes.
-  **DO** wash your hands or use alcohol-based hand sanitizer before and after touching the mask or face covering.
-  **DO** ensure your nose and mouth are fully covered.
-  **DO** wash your mask with hot, soapy water and let it dry completely before wearing it again.
-  **DO** discard masks that cannot be washed in a plastic-lined garbage bin after use.
-  **DO** ensure the mask is made of at least two layers of tightly woven fabric.
-  **DO** ensure the mask or face covering is clean and dry.
-  **DO** use the ear loops or ties to put on and remove the mask.
-  **DO** replace and launder your mask whenever it becomes damp or dirty.
-  **DO** store reusable masks in a clean paper bag until you wear it again.

DO YOUR PART.

Wear a non-medical mask or face covering to protect others when you can't maintain a 2-metre distance.


NON-MEDICAL MASKS ARE NOT RECOMMENDED FOR:

- People who suffer from an illness or disabilities that make it difficult to put on or take off a mask
- Those who have difficulty breathing
- Children under the age of 2

DON'T JUDGE OTHERS FOR NOT WEARING A MASK.

Kindness is important as some people may not be able to wear a mask or face covering.

DON'TS

-  **DON'T** reuse masks that are moist, dirty or damaged.
-  **DON'T** wear a loose mask.
-  **DON'T** touch the mask while wearing it.
-  **DON'T** remove the mask to talk to someone.
-  **DON'T** hang the mask from your neck or ears.
-  **DON'T** share your mask.
-  **DON'T** leave your used mask within the reach of others.

REMEMBER, wearing a non-medical mask or face covering alone will not prevent the spread of COVID-19. You must also wash your hands often, practise physical distancing and stay home if you are sick.
