Greater Moncton International Airport Authority (GMIAA) is continuing to monitor developments related to the spread of the coronavirus disease (COVID-19). The health and wellness of our passengers, visitors, business partners and employees are our top priority.

# **Airline Operations**

Reminder that our airline schedule may change at anytime, passengers are asked to contact their airline for the latest information about their flight.

## **WESTJET**<sup>L</sup>

WestJet currently operates 3 days a week to Toronto (YYZ) on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays until August 4.

From August 5 until September 4, WestJet will be operating 5 days a week to YYZ (Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, Fridays and Sundays).

## **AIR CANADA**<sup>∠</sup>

Air Canada resumed operation with one daily flight to Toronto (YYZ) and Montreal (YUL) until July 19. From July 20 to July 31, an additional flight to YYZ will be added - exceptions may apply.

Flights to Halifax (YHZ) and Ottawa (YOW) are suspended indefinitely.

Porter Airlines flights are temporary suspended and expected to resume activity August 31.



Before you travel to (or through) New Brunswick, consult our website and ensure you have the proper documentation to enter.

As of July 3, Atlantic Canadians will be able to travel to and from New Brunswick without the requirement to self-isolate but will be asked to identify themselves and provide proof of their province of residence.









Documents like a provincial driver's license can help do both. Other documents that can help support screening at a NB point of entry are online at: <a href="https://bit.ly/3dSGpvB">https://bit.ly/3dSGpvB</a>. All documentation and photo identification must be current.

Filling out your roadside questionnaire before arriving at the border will help save time. You can print the document at http://bit.ly/3dVD9PW fill it out and have it with you upon arriving at your point of entry.

Travellers to Canada: be aware that mandatory measures for travellers, that include the requirement to isolate or quarantine for 14 days on entry, have been extended until August 31.

As part of the new measures, all employees and personnel who enter or work in the restricted area of some airports will be subject to temperature screening procedures.
